The experience and qualifications of the preferred candidate will be considered in the final arrangement of classes for 2024.

You will have a sound understanding of the curriculum and be familiar with the new curriculum currently being implemented. - An understanding of and affinity with primary aged children, particularly in the context of wellbeing, pastoral care and child development
- Professional and personal attributes and interests that would contribute to the particular role and to the wider life of the College
